Key Objectives

- To increase the number of proficient swimmers at the end of KS2.
- To increase children's involvement in intra and inter school competitions (School Games)
- To increase children's rates of participation in sports and physical activity.
- To target specific non active pupils to participate in sports clubs.
- To monitor the expenditure of the Sports Premium Funding to see which elements have sustainable impact.

Success Criteria

- The quality of P.E lessons delivered by coaches and teachers is observed to be good or better.
- The number of children achieving 25m in swimming by the end of Year 6 is increased.
- There is a higher number of sports teams and the school is involved more widely in competitive fixtures.
- There is an increase in participation rates for extra-curricular sport and physical activity.
